## 175 SISTER PROFILES: Sister Mildred Schubert

## Sister Maryanne Fitzgerald

Insightful, energizing, warm—these are the qualities that come to mind when we think of Sister Mildred
Schubert. Mildred, better known to us as Millie, and her identical twin
Marjorie, better known to us as
Margie, were born on March 7, 1944 in Richmond Hill, NY. They have two older brothers and a younger sister. Millie and Margie grew up in
St. James, Long Island, on the same block as Sister Julia Heslin!

Millie and Margie graduated from
Seton Hall High School, Patchogue in
June of 1961. That September they
travelled to Halifax, Margie to enter
the Congregation and Millie to start
her freshman year at

Mt. St. Vincent College, using the scholarship she had received. Millie soon followed in the footsteps of Margie (now Sister Mildred Thomas). Entering in the fall of 1962, Sister Millie was professed in

1965, with the religious name
Sister Robert Thomas, and was
missioned in 1967. Margie,
Sister Mildred Thomas, was
professed in 1964 and missioned
in 1966. She ultimately followed

another path, leaving the Congregation in 1968 and later marrying. Margie is now a proud mother and grandmother.

For 14 years S. Millie served at St. Nicholas of Tolentine School, first as a teacher of grades 6, 7, and

8 then as the school psychologist.

After next working as a psychological consultant for children in foster care placement, S. Millie spent 21 years as a school psychologist at St. Francis Preparatory High School located in the original Bishop Reilly High School.

S. Millie also had a private practice, providing psychotherapy for children, adolescents and adults—specializing in women's issues, stress reduction and bereavement.

This professional background and these ministerial experiences, combined with those qualities mentioned at the outset—insightful, energizing and warm—were the perfect blend S. Millie shared with so many religious in her ministry as the Director of the Religious Consultation Service of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, NY for over 10 years. Through her leadership, the Religious Consultation Service provided referrals for religious seeking the support of a professional therapist when dealing with important personal issues.

S. Millie was the first contact for each religious seeking a referral—listening carefully and compassionately and then offering options for therapists to be contacted. Her guidance and support were essential to the flourishing of this ministry.

Using her own professional education and training as a psychologist, S. Millie was an invaluable resource to many of the leadership teams of religious congregations serving in the diocese. S. Millie guided them through challenging personnel situations and assisted them in their interactions with individual religious and local communities as needs arose.

S. Millie's ministry as the Director of the Religious Consultation

Service rested in her person—her approach, her skills and her

genuine caring for each person she encountered were the hallmarks

of her ministry—"giving joyful witness to love: the love of God, of

one another and of all persons" (Constitutions 1).



2012 -- Sister Millie received the Founders Award for her service to religious and clergy of the Rockville Centre Diocese, NY where she has been Director of the Consultation Service for Religious Personnel for the past 10 years. In 2005 she expanded the service to the nearby Brooklyn diocese.
